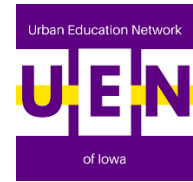


ADVOCACY DURING AN ELECTION YEAR

CONNECT WITH A POLICYMAKER BEFORE (AND AFTER) THE NOVEMBER 3, 2026 GENERAL ELECTION



Go to the Iowa Legislative Website and look up your Senator/Representative:

Check out the Iowa Secretary of State's Candidate Listing to determine who is running to represent you, which includes home address, phone, and email contact information:

Do one (or more) of the following:

1. Send them a thank-you note, for their service (if they are in office) or thank them for running (if they are a new candidate). Let them know their job is tough, and you can empathize. Ask them to support one or two key education issues important to your district. Check out the UEN Issue Briefs for one or two sentences to say about the issue. 2. Sign up to receive their newsletter.
3. Learn about their educational background and experience. Click on their name from the websites above, go to their personal website, use the Legislative Bios posted on the ISFIS website (www.iowaSchoolFinance.com), or just do a Google search.
4. Send them an email or letter asking a question about education. (It could be as simple as, "How do you best like to get information about how issues before you may impact your schools?")
5. Find sample questions to ask candidates, whether planning an individual conversation or an organized local event, on the UEN website at: <https://www.uen-ia.org/elections>
6. Contribute to their campaign (\$25 or more gets your name on a list of contributors).
7. Volunteer for a campaign (you can have a public-facing role or a role behind the scenes, just stuffing envelopes or doing any number of other tasks).
8. Follow them throughout the 2026 General Election.
9. Send a "Congrats Letter" after the election and offer to meet to discuss key issues impacting your students and communities.
